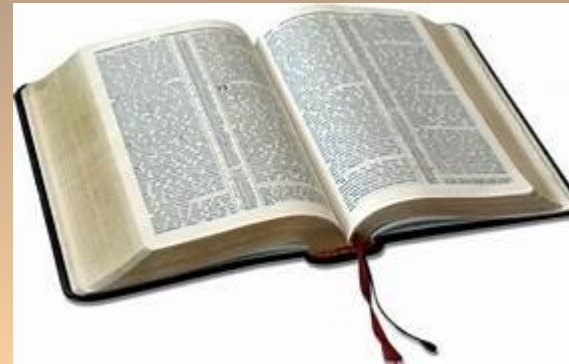

- **1. *Evangelism*** – teaching all “nations” (or people groups, nationalities, race, etc) about the gospel (or “good news”) of Jesus’ atoning death and resurrection.

- **2. *Baptism*** - The first step of obedience for those who have received Christ, and the act that publically confirms them as members of a Christian congregation.

- **3. *Discipleship*** – The process of teaching Jesus's new followers doctrine and Christ-like living. (Acts 2:42, Ephesians 2:19 & 20)

- **What was Christ's method?**



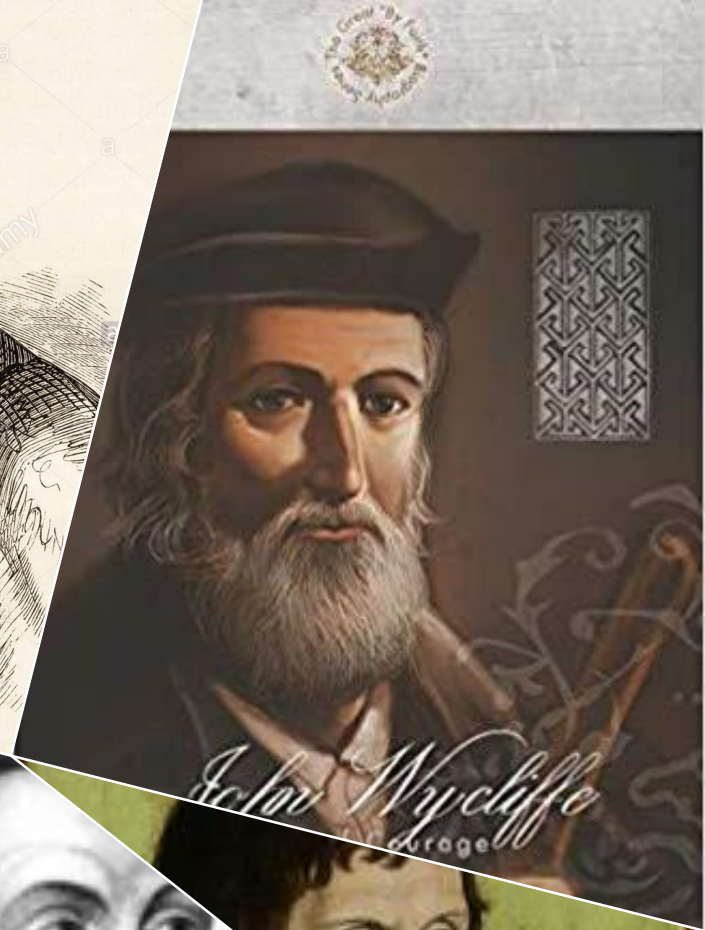
Christ's Method

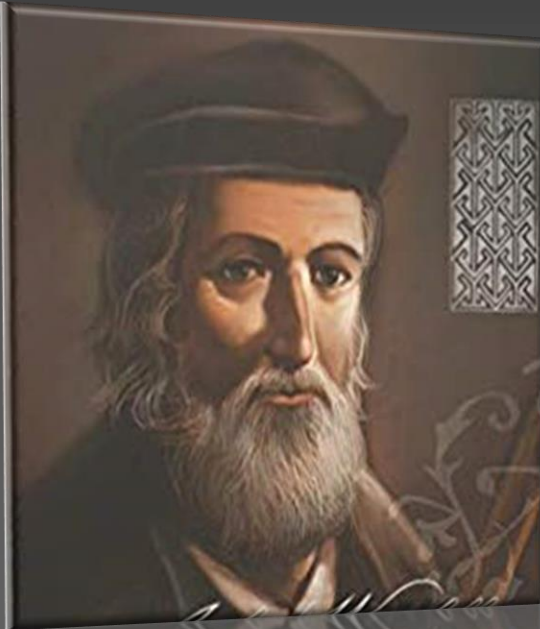
Christ's Method Recap



Youth Through History



John Wycliffe (1330 – 1384)



Organized a group of preachers

Taught in the market place, streets of great cities and country lanes

Actively looked for the people who were sick or poor or the older people in the communities and preached to them

Preached the word of God in the halls of the universities

Was known as the 'Gospel Doctor'

Translated the scriptures into English

(1369 – 1415)

John Huss

- Many German students received their first knowledge of the bible from John Huss.
- He was pivotal in propelling biblical truths throughout Europe and beyond.
- His writing and his preaching made him a well known household name.
- His greatest legacy is the millions of Christians who have heard, read and accepted the biblical gospel of Jesus Christ in their own language.
 - Many have been moved to follow Jesus because of Huss.

Jerome of Prague

- Jerome moved about a good deal, spreading reform doctrines in Paris, Jerusalem, Heidelberg, Vienna, Russia, Lithuania, Hungary and Cologne.
 - He preached reformation a century before Luther.

Through these men God was leading the people out of the darkness of Romanism

Martin Luther (1483 – 1546)



He was a champion of truth.

He made it his mission to share about the offensive character of sin.

He taught that:

- 1) It is impossible for man, by his own works to lessen its guilt or evade punishment
- 2) That Only repentance toward God and faith in Christ can save the sinner
- 3) The grace of Christ cannot be purchased; it is a free gift

He nailed a copy of his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle church which ignited a revolution and reformation.

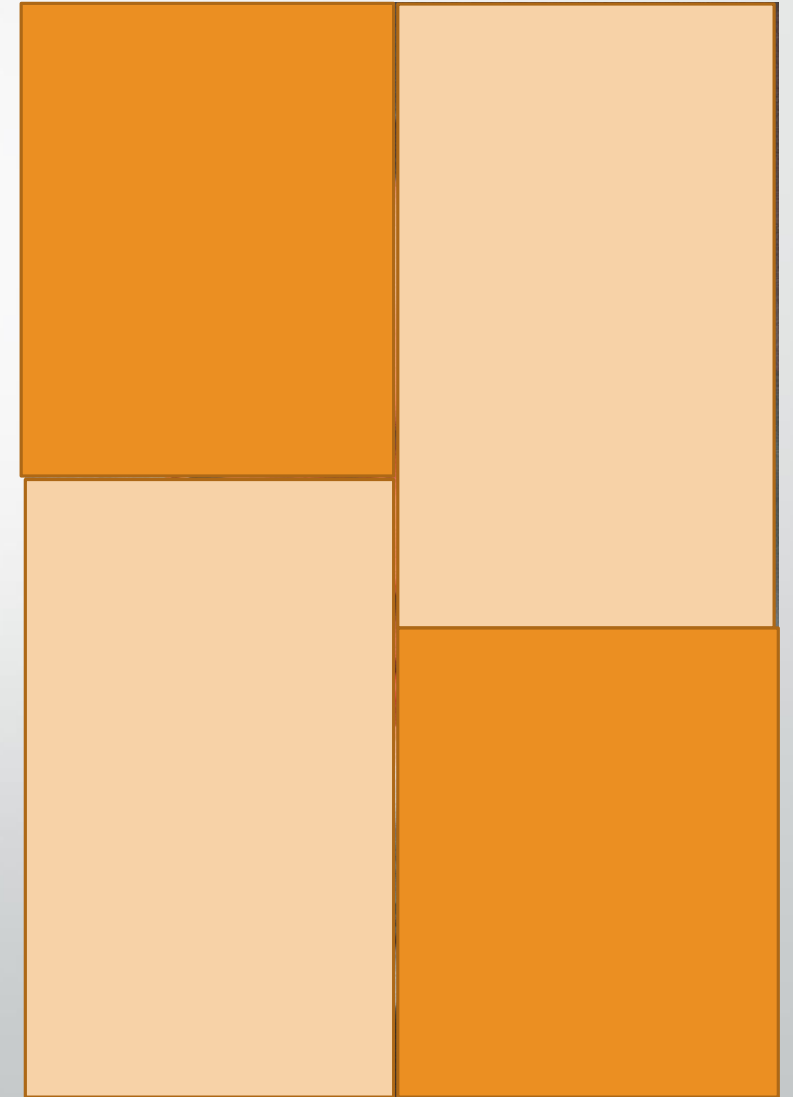
Who am I?

I expected that the second coming would occur on 22nd October 1844



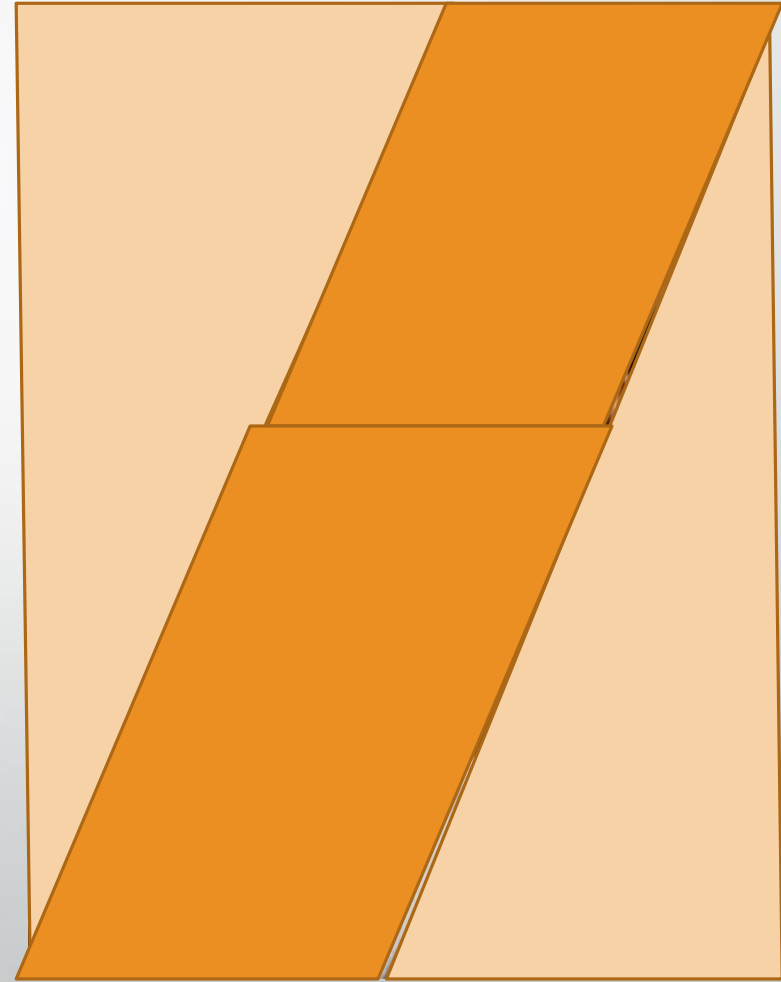
Who am I?

My middle name is Springer



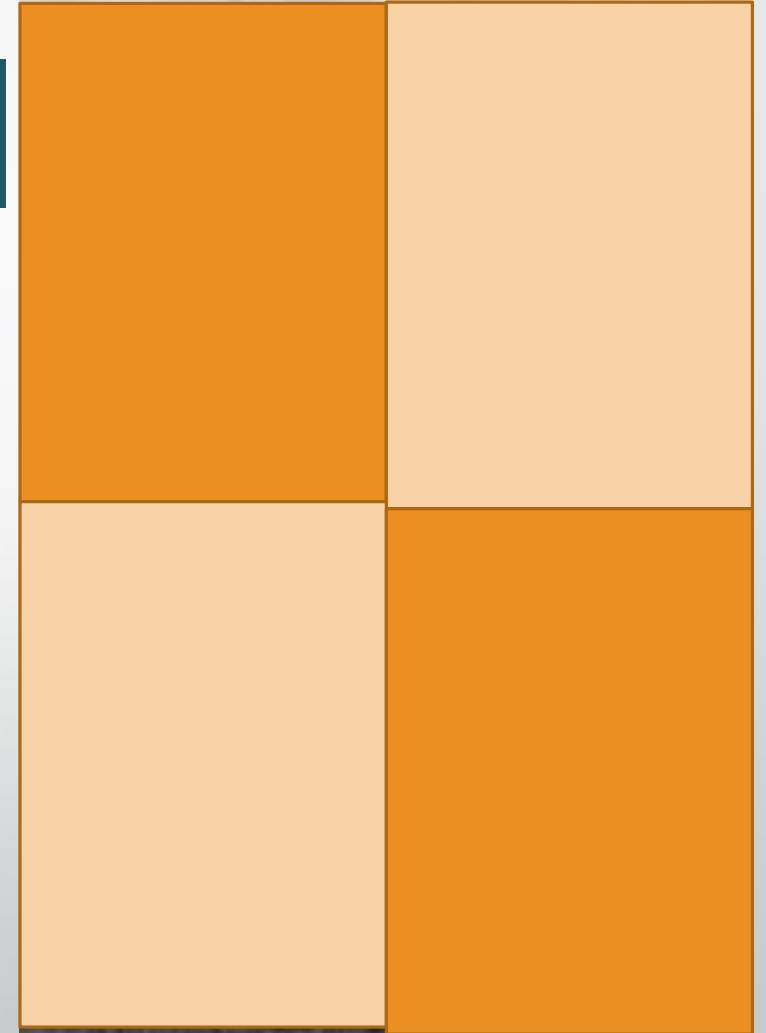
Who am I?

I wrote Daniel and the Revelation



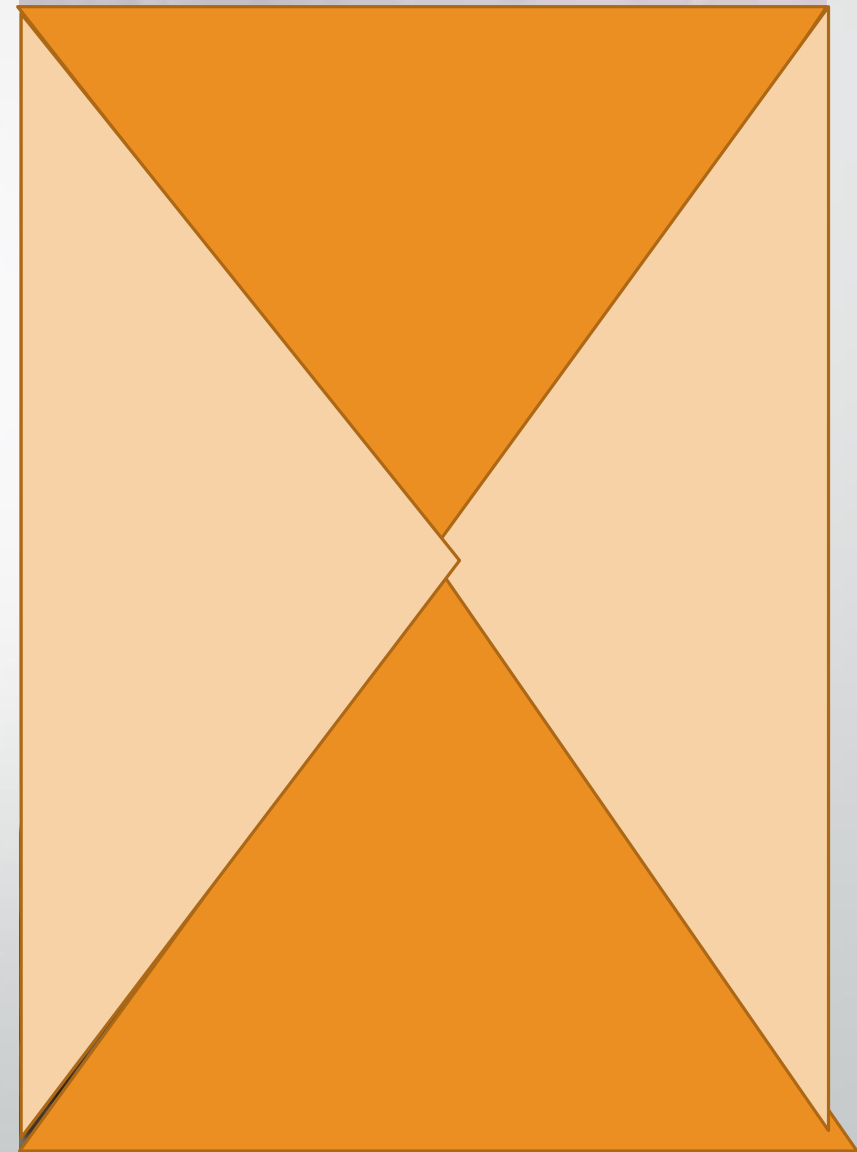
Who am I?

There is a school named after me



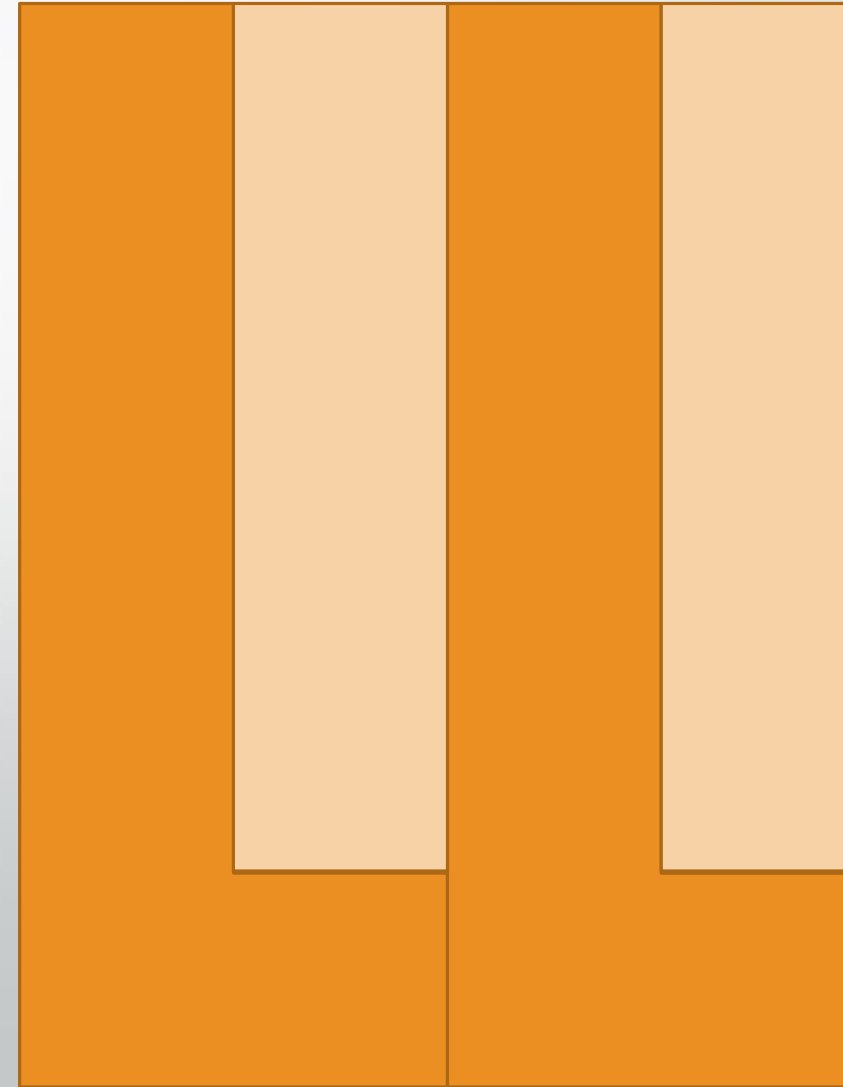
Who am I?


I was an American seaman

I was a co-founder of the SDA church


I wrote a 48 page booklet called 'The Seventh Day, A Perpetual Sign'
